STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

RESOLVE, Relating to Fishing in Flanders Bay.

Fishing in Flanders Bay, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries is hereby directed to issue the following rule and regulation:

'All persons are hereby prohibited from taking any smelts by means of purse or drag seines or weirs, or in any other manner except by hook and line, in the waters of Flanders Bay or its tributaries lying above a straight line drawn from Taft Point in the town of Gouldsboro, in the county of Hancock, westerly to the southeastern point of Doans Point in the town of Sorrento, in the county of Hancock.

Whoever shall violate the provisions hereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$500, or by imprisonment for not less than 60 days.'
