STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Permitting Signboards Under Certain Conditions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Signboards permitted under certain conditions. Notwithstanding any provisions of law to the contrary, any owner of a business may advertise such business on signboards on his own property, provided, however, that any such owner may advertise such business on signboards not exceeding 5 in number on other property, and that no such signboard shall be erected or placed without permission from the owner or the lessee of the land on which such signboard is to be placed, and provided, further, that this act shall not be construed as limiting any existing provisions of law relating to the use of signboards, but shall be construed as an extension of the right to use signboards.
