STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend the Corporate Purposes of Louis Kirstein & Sons.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Corporate purposes amended. Louis Kirstein & Sons, a corporation organized under the general law of the state of Maine, is hereby empowered to act as executor, administrator, guardian, receiver or assignee with the same powers and duties as are imposed by law upon natural persons acting in the same capacities and subject to the same control of the court having jurisdiction of the same, in all proceedings relating to the exercise of these powers: all papers may be signed and sworn to by any officer designated by the corporation for that purpose, and the officers shall be subject to citation and examination in the same manner, and to the same extent as natural persons acting in the same capacities. No sureties shall be required upon the bond of the corporation when acting in said capacities unless the court or officer approving said bond shall require.

Sec. 2. Further authority. In carrying on its business, or for the purpose of attaining or furthering any of its purposes, the corporation may do any and all acts and things, and exercise any and all powers which a natural person could do and exercise and which now or hereafter may be authorized by law.

Sec. 3. Construction. The foregoing clauses shall be construed both as purposes and powers, but no recitation, expression or declaration of specific or special purposes or powers herein enumerated shall be deemed to be exclusive; but it is hereby expressly declared that all other lawful powers not inconsistent therewith are hereby included.
