**AN ACT To Provide For The Reduction of the Ad Damnum in Writs in
the Superior Court.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Reduction of ad damnum in writs. In any action pending in or returnable to the superior court, any justice of the superior court, in term time or vacation, on written motion of any defendant and after notice to all other parties to the action and hearing thereon may make an order that the ad damnum of the writ in said action, if found by him to be excessive, be reduced to such amount as he may deem adequate to fully protect the plaintiff.
