IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-ONE

AN ACT to Exempt Soldiers and Sailors from Poll Taxes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 13, § 6, ¶ IX, amended. So much of the first sentence of paragraph IX of section 6 of chapter 13 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'The polls and the estates of persons who by reason of age, infirmity or poverty, are in the judgment of the assessors unable to contribute toward the public charges; the polls of all soldiers and sailors who served in the army or navy of the United States in the war of 1861-1865, and were honorably discharged from such service; the polls of all soldiers, sailors and marines who receive state pension **or who have been inducted into the service of the United States;** the polls of all soldiers, sailors and marines who served in the Indian wars;'
