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**AN ACT Relating to Qualifications of Instructors in Hairdressing.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

**P. L., 1933, c. 282, § 5, amended.** The last sentence of section 5 of chapter 282 of the public laws of 1933, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows :

‘No person shall be engaged to instruct in any of the branches of hairdressing and beauty culture as defined in section 1 of this act unless said instructor **shall have completed 4 years attendance at a recognized high school, and** has a certificate to practice hairdressing and beauty culture under the provisions of this act, excepting physicians as specified above.’
