IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Aid to Needy Children.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1937, c. 177, § 1, amended. That part designated “(b)” of section 1 of chapter 177 of the public laws of 1937 is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘(b) The term “dependent child” wherever used in this act shall be construed to mean a **needy** child under the age of 16, **or under the age of 18 if found by the state agency to be regularly attending school**, who has been deprived of parental support or care by reason of the death, continued absence from home, or the physical or mental incapacity of a parent and who is living with his father, mother, grandfather, grandmother, brother, sister, stepfather, stepmother, stepbrother, stepsister, uncle or aunt in a place of residence maintained by 1 or more of such relatives as his or their own home;’
