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### AN ACT Relating to the Parole Board.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**P. L., 1939, c. 223, § 7, ¶ 1, amended.** The 1st paragraph of section 7 of chapter 223 of the public laws of 1939 is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

‘Sec. 7. Parole board. There shall be a parole board in the department of institutional service consisting of the commissioner of institutional service and any 2 persons appointed by the governor. The members appointed by the governor shall be paid their expenses and shall receive compensation at the rate of \$5 per day for each day actually spent in the work of the board. Such board shall have authority to grant or revoke all paroles in connection with the state penal and correctional institutions, and, from time to time, shall make recommendations to the governor in reference to the granting of reprieves, commutations and pardons.’
