## STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

#### AN ACT Relative to Taking of Salmon in Penobscot River.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 50, § 27, amended.** Section 27 of chapter 50 of the revised statutes, as revised and amended, is hereby further amended by inserting the following as the first sentence thereof:

'It shall be illegal to take salmon in Penobscot river, its tributaries and Penobscot Bay by traps or weirs between the time of first low tide on Saturday of each week and the time of first low tide on Monday of the following week, during the legal open season on salmon April 1st to July 15th, inclusive, of each year and requiring that every trap or weir used in such fishing be equipped with an adequate gate that must be removed and taken ashore to permit the release of salmon that enter such traps or weirs during the aforesaid 2 day periods.'
