STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Relative to Fish and Game Wardens in the Military Service.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 38, § 13-I, additional. Chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 13-I, and to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 13-I. Provisions of fish and game wardens while in military service. 1. Any inland fish and game warden who enters the military or naval service of the United States shall be given a leave of absence without pay covering the period of his national service, and for the purpose of computing time in regard to pension rights and seniority shall be considered as in the service of the state during the period of his national service.
- 2. Any person on the eligible list for appointment to the warden service as established by the civil service code shall remain on said list during any period he may serve in a military or naval service of the United States and for one year thereafter.
 - 3. This act shall cease to be effective on January 1, 1944.
