STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Trapping in Washington County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 72, amended. The first 4 paragraphs of section 72 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, are hereby amended to read as follows:

'(a) There shall be a perpetual closed season on hunting or trapping any fur-bearing animal, except as provided in this chapter and whoever has in possession at any time any fur-bearing animal or part thereof taken in closed season shall be subject to the penalties of section 107. Fur-bearing animals taken in open season shall not be kept alive in closed season except under the provisions of section 9. The open season on muskrats shall be as follows:

March 20th to April 20th in the counties of Androscoggin, Cumberland, Kennebec, Knox, Lincoln, Sagadahoc, Waldo and York.

April 1st to April 3oth and from November 1st to November 3oth in the counties of Franklin, Hancock, Penobscot, Piscataquis, Somerset, and Oxford and Washington.

April 1st to April 30th in the county of Washington.'
