STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to the Measurement of Lobsters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1933, c. 2, § 89, amended. The 1st sentence of section 89 of chapter 2 of the public laws of 1933, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'No person shall buy, or sell, give away, or expose for sale, or possess for any purpose any lobsters, (1) during the period ending March 1, 1942, less than 3 ±/±6 3 2/16 inches or more than 5 inches in length, or (2) during the period from March 1, 1942 to March 1, 1943 less than 3 3/16 inches or more than 5 inches in length, or (3) thereafter less than 3 4/16 inches or more than 5 inches in length, alive or dead, cooked or uncooked, measured from the rear shell to the rear end of the body shell; and any lobster shorter than 3 ±/±6 inches which when caught (1) during the period ending March 1, 1942, shall be less than 3 2/16 inches or more than 5 inches in length, or (2) during the period from March 1, 1942 to March 1, 1943 shall be less than 3 3/16 inches or more than 5 inches in length, or (3) thereafter shall be less than 3 4/16 inches or more than 5 inches in length, shall be immediately liberated alive at the risk and cost of the parties taking it, under a penalty

of \$5 for each lobster so caught, bought, sold, given away, exposed for sale, or in possession and any lobster longer than 5 inches when caught shall be immediately liberated alive at the risk and cost of the parties taking it, under a penalty of \$25 for each lobster so caught, bought, sold, given away, exposed for sale or in possession.'
