RESOLVE, Relating to Men Enlisting in the Federal Service.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, a large number of men who have recently purchased licenses have volunteered for or have been inducted into federal service; and

Whereas, they cannot hire managers under the present law; and

Whereas, they would suffer a heavy financial loss due to their service for their country; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of Article XXXI of the constitution, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Certain provisions in aid of federal enlistments. Resolved: That men enlisting in the federal service who have purchased malt liquor licenses may hire managers to operate their places of business while they are in the service, subject to the approval of the liquor commissioner.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble this resolve shall take effect when approved.
