STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Employees of the State Inducted Into Military Service.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Payments to state employees inducted into military service. There shall be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the state to every person who, on the 1st day of November 1940, or subsequent thereto was, or may be, in the employ of the state, and who has been, or shall be, inducted into federal military service, under the provisions of the selective service act shall continue to receive 10% of the amount of the compensation he was receiving from the state at the time of the termination of his services with it which shall be payable at the same time as is paid the compensation of the employees of the state; the same shall be sent to the person to whose order such is drawn, or to his wife, child, or parent, or to any other person designated by the beneficiary by a writing filed with the treasurer of state. Such payments shall continue so long as he continues in the military or naval service of the United States but shall cease 1 month after his discharge therefrom. In case of his death, in said service, his widow, minor children or parents shall receive the same amount he was receiving until the termination of the present emergency.
