IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Water Level of Lake Torsey.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Water level of Lake Torsey, regulated. No person, firm or corporation shall draw water from Lake Torsey or Greely pond in Readfield and Mount Vernon, in Kennebec county, during the months of June, July, August and September when the water level of said lake is 3 feet below the established high water mark.

Any violation of this chapter shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment for not more than 3 months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
