STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Preference in State Examinations for Selective Service Inductees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Preference in examinations. All students in universities and colleges recognized and chartered under the law of the state of Maine and all those persons not attending such universities and colleges but engaged in a course of study and who are eligible for examination before any of the boards of this state for license to engage in any profession or business regulated by such boards, whose course of study or preparation is interrupted by being inducted into the armed forces of the United States under the United States Selective Service Act of 1940, upon taking said examination within one year from the date of discharge from said service under said act shall be given a passing grade in said examination if they attain 10 points less than the passing grade as now established by law.
