AN ACT Relating to the Legal Length of Lobsters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1933, c. 2, § 89, amended. Section 89 of chapter 2 of the public laws of 1933, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof the following:

‘The governor is hereby authorized and directed to issue a proclamation upon receipt of a written request from the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries increasing the minimum measure of lobsters as set forth in this section from 3 $\frac{1}{16}$ inches to 3 $\frac{2}{16}$ inches during the year 1941, and to 3 $\frac{3}{16}$ inches during the year 1942.’
