AN ACT Relative to Field Trials and Training Bird or Coon Dogs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 55-A, additional. Chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 55-A and to read as follows:

‘Sec. 55-A. Field trials permitted for bird dogs or coon dogs. It shall be lawful to hold bird dog or coon dog field trials at any time. During the field trials permitted in this section, no person shall use any firearm other than a pistol loaded with blank ammunition.’
