# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

#### AN ACT Relative to Standish Game Preserve.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 90, amended. The paragraph of section 90 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, relating to the Standish game preserve is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Standish: The territory within the following described limits situated in the towns of Standish, Baldwin and Sebago in the county of Cumberland, beginning at the intersection of the state highway No. 113 with the Maine Central railroad tracks in Steep Falls Village in the town of Standish; thence northwesterly along said highway to the village of East Baldwin in the town of Baldwin; thence northerly along state aid highway No. 11 to the village of East Sebago in the town of Sebago to its intersection with route No. 114; thence southeasterly along state aid road No. 114 to Richville crossing, so-called, where said road intersects with the Maine Central railroad tracks; thence westerly along said railroad tracks to the point of beginning including therein the boundaries of the highways mentioned, and the railroad right of way.'
