**RESOLVE, for the Laying of the County Taxes for the Year Nineteen
Hundred Forty-one.**

Emergency preamble. Whereas the several counties hereinafter named have certain expenses and liabilities which must be met as they become due, and

Whereas, the several counties have no source of revenue except the taxes hereinafter mentioned, and

Whereas, it is necessary that the taxes hereinafter mentioned be immediately assessed in order to provide the required revenue for the several counties, and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of Article 31 of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Resolved: County taxes apportioned. That the sum appearing opposite to the names of the counties in the following schedule is hereby granted as a tax on each county respectively to be appropriated, assessed, collected and applied to the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same and for other purposes of law, for the year 1941.

Resolved: That the county taxes of the several counties for the year 1941 may be apportioned during the month of April of said year upon the last state valuation.
