**RESOLVE, to Reimburse Aroostook Central Institute for Tuition Owed
by the Town of Blaine.**

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to
Aroostook Central Institute, the sum of \$2235.07, to reimburse said in-
stitute for tuition owed by the town of Blaine, said sum to be paid from
the general funds of the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This resolve is for the following accounts:

Tuition owed Aroostook Central Institute by the Town of Blaine:—

School Year—1937 and 1938	\$2235.07
---------------------------	-----------

The above amount concerns the unpaid tuition owed Aroostook Central Institute by the Town of Blaine at the close of the school year 1937 and 1938. September 1, 1938, concerning the above named unpaid tuition, proper returns were made to the Commissioner of Education. December 1, 1938, a deduction of the above amount was made by the Commissioner of Education from the Blaine State School Fund to be transferred to the Aroostook Central Institute account for unpaid tuition. However, on advice of the Attorney General, the amount above stated was sent to the Town of Blaine. This step was taken because of the Emergency Municipal Relief Act on October 14, 1938, which declared all bills incurred prior to October 14, 1938 were impounded. After September 1, 1938, when proper returns were made to the commissioner of Education as above set forth, this bill was no longer a liability of the Town of Blaine, but an obligation of the State of Maine.
