STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Pensions of State Employees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Sec. 1. P. L., 1933, c. 1, § 228, amended. Section 228 of chapter 1 of the public laws of 1933 is hereby amended to read as follows :

'Sec. 228. Any officer or employee who is retired; pension amount. Any officer or employee who is retired, as provided in the preceding section, shall be allowed such amount as the governor and council shall determine not to exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ of the average wage or salary he was receiving for the 5 years previous to the time of his retirement. **In the case of superintendents of schools, the terms "wage" or "salary" used in this act shall mean the actual wages or salary received without reference to the amounts directly or indirectly contributed by the state.'**

Sec. 2. P. L., 1933, c. 1, § 229, amended. Section 229 of chapter 1 of the public laws of 1933, is hereby amended to read as follows :

'Sec. 229. "Employee" defined. The word "employee" shall be held to include clerks and other employees of the several state departments and state institutions; also teachers in the state normal schools and the Madawaska training school, including such teachers as have retired since March

1st, 1920; also superintendents of schools in service as such prior to July 1st, 1924. Provided, however, said superintendents shall not receive a pension in excess of \$1200 per year.'
