RESOLVE, Relating to Ice Fishing in East Grand Lake.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the resolve relating to ice fishing in East Grand Lake, which was passed at the last regular session of the legislature, does not fulfill its intended purpose; and

Whereas, it is causing confusion among the wardens and inhabitants of Aroostook and Washington counties; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of Article XXXI of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Resolve relating to ice fishing in East Grand lake, amended. Resolved: That chapter 66 of the resolves of 1941, relating to ice fishing in East Grand lake be, and hereby is, amended to read as follows:

'East Grand lake; opened to ice fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and

directed to issue a rule and regulation opening East Grand lake in ~~the town of Weston, Aroostook and Washington county counties,~~ to ice fishing during the months of **January**, February and March of each year.'

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.
