**AN ACT Relating to Inspection of Motor Vehicle Tires.**

---

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, a state of war exists between the United States and Germany, Italy, Japan and other foreign countries; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature this fact creates an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of Article XXXI of the constitution of Maine and requires the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**P. L., 1939, c. 169, amended.** The 1st sentence of chapter 169 of the public laws of 1939, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Every person who is the owner or in control of a motor vehicle registered and operated upon the highways of the state shall submit such vehicles for semiannual inspection as hereafter provided, to determine the proper adjustment and sufficiency of the following required equipment: brakes, lights, running gear, wheels, ~~tires~~, horns, windshields, mechanical windshield wipers, rear-view mirrors, reflectors and mufflers.'

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.
