STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Health Officers for the Indian Tribes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L. 1933, c. 1, §§ 290, 281-A, amended. Section 290 and section 281-A, as enacted by chapter 270 of the public laws of 1941, are hereby repealed, and the following new section, to be numbered section 243, is hereby inserted in place thereof:

'Sec. 243. Health officers provided for. The commissioner of health and welfare shall upon recommendation of the director of health appoint health officers for the reservations of the Penobscot and Passamaquoddy tribes of Indians. Such health officers shall be physicians or other persons approved because of training and experience in public health work. They shall serve for a term of 3 years or until their successors be appointed and approved, for such compensation as may be determined by the commissioner.'
