## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Agents for the Indian Tribes.

P. L., 1933, c. 1, §§ 242, 243, amended. Sections 242 and 243 of chapter 1 of the public laws of 1933 are hereby repealed and the following new section enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 242. Agents, appointment and tenure. Agents for the Penobscot and Passamaquoddy tribes of Indians shall be appointed by the commissioner of health and welfare, and hold their office during the pleasure of said commissioner, and said commissioner shall fill vacancies as they may occur.'
