**AN ACT Providing for the Maintenance of the Road Leading to Baxter
State Park.**

Emergency preamble. Whereas, former Governor Baxter has given a large area of land to the state of Maine; and

Whereas, there is only one road leading to Baxter State Park; and

Whereas, the road leading to said Park will be in need of immediate repair after the spring rains; and

Whereas, if this maintenance is not provided for immediately, the road will not be passable and the value and use of Governor Baxter's gift will be depreciated; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of Article XXXI of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Maintenance of road to Baxter State Park provided for. The state highway commission is hereby authorized and directed to expend as much as is necessary up to \$3,000 per year, from the general highway funds, for the

maintenance of the road leading to Baxter State Park, starting from Greenville, Gore A-2, town line and ending at Millinocket, excepting those portions that receive state aid maintenance.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.
