## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Trapping in Unorganized Territory.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 50, amended. The first 2 sentences of section 50 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, are hereby amended to read as follows:

Any person trapping in any organized or incorporated place shall visit each trap or cause the same to be visited at least once in every 24 hours, except beaver sets so called, and remove therefrom, or cause to be removed, any animal found caught therein. No person shall trap on or in any organized or incorporated place, or in any unorganized place on land that is used for agricultural purposes, or on land that is used by the owner thereof for dwelling purposes, without first obtaining the written consent of the owner or occupant of the land on which said trap is to be set.'
