# STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

#### AN ACT Relating to Reports, Publications, Etc. of Departments.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 3, §§ 7, 8, amended.** Sections 7 and 8 of chapter 3 of the revised statutes are hereby repealed and the following section enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 7. Reports of departments; publication and distribution; copies; other publications. The reports of all state departments, commissions, and institutions may be printed and bound, but the number and styles in which the same shall be so printed and bound at the expense of the state shall be determined from time to time by the governor and council. The reports shall be printed biennially covering the 2 fiscal years next preceding each legislative year and shall be ready for distribution upon the convening of the legislature at its regular biennial sessions. At least 175 copies of these reports shall be delivered to the librarian of the Maine state library, immediately upon receipt by the superintendent of public printing, for exchange, library use and general distribution; and the balance of the number of each report shall be delivered by said superintendent to the head of the department or institution where it originated and where it was prepared for publication. At least 10 copies of all other publications, including periodicals, bulletins, pamphlets, leaflets, and special reports, issued by any department, commission, or institution of the state, or by any legislative committee, shall be delivered to the state librarian.'

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
