# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

#### AN ACT Amending the Teachers' Pension Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 19, § 220, amended. Section 220 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 220. Teachers who may receive an annual pension of \$400. Except as provided in section 248, any person of either sex who, on the 30th day of September, 1913, or thereafter, shall have reached the age of 60 years and who for 30 years shall have engaged in teaching as his principal occupation, and who shall have in all other respects met the requirements of the preceding section 219 shall, on his formal application, receive from the state for the remainder of his life an annual pension of three hundred seventy five dollars \$400.'
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 19, § 221, amended. Section 221 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 221. Teachers who may receive an annual pension of \$300. Except as provided in section 248, any person of either sex who, on the 30th day of September, 1913, or thereafter, shall have reached the age of 60 years and who for 25 years shall have been engaged in teaching as his

principal occupation, and who shall have in all other respects met the requirements of section 219 shall, on his formal application, receive from the state for the remainder of his life an annual pension of two hundred seventy five dollars \$300.'
