AN ACT Relating to the Sale of Oils.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 49, §§ 25, 26, 27, 28, repealed. Sections 25, 26, 27 and 28 of chapter 49 of the revised statutes are hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 49, additional. Chapter 49 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 35-A, and to read as follows :

'Sec. 35-A. Regulation of sale of certain oils. No person shall sell or keep for sale, except for remanufacture or as hereinafter provided, kerosene, range oil, fuel oil or other burning oil for illuminating, heating or cooking purposes which will flash at a temperature of less than 115 degrees Fahrenheit, to be ascertained by the application of any standard approved closed cup tester. Nothing herein contained shall prohibit the sale or keeping for sale of gasoline or naphtha as such for fuel or illuminating purposes.'
