STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the Appropriation for and Assistance to the Maine Maritime Academy.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1941, c. 37, § 4, amended. Section 4 of chapter 37 of the private and special laws of 1941, as amended by section 4 of chapter 102 of the private and special laws of 1941, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 4. State aid. In addition to the income provided by the provisions of section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$100,000 shall be appropriated biennially from which such sums as may be necessary for the proper operation of the school and the treasurer of state or his successor shall, upon request of the trustees, make advances grants for the such operation of the school not to exceed \$50,000 per annum to the treasurer of the school, who shall give bond in an amount to be set by the governor and council, but not less than \$15,000, with sureties approved by the governor and council, for its proper disbursement.'

102 of the private and special laws of 1941, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph to read as follows:

'Every department and agency of the state, when requested, shall furnish such assistance, counsel, or advice as the trustees may require in the discharge of their duties.'
