STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Vital Statistics; Birth Certificates of Foundlings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1933, c. 1, § 68-A, additional. Chapter 1 of the public laws of 1933 is hereby amended by adding thereto a section to be numbered section 68-A, and to read as follows:

'Sec. 68-A. Birth certificates of foundlings; foundling report. Whoever assumes the custody of a child of unknown parentage shall immediately report to the local town or city clerk in writing: (a) the date and place of finding or assumption of custody; (b) sex; color or race; and approximate age of child; (c) name and address of the person or institution with whom the child has been placed for care, and (d) name given to the child by the finder or custodian. The place where the child was found or custody assumed shall be known as the place of birth and the date of birth shall be determined by approximation. The report shall constitute the certificate of birth. If the child is identified and a regular certificate of birth is found or obtained, the certificate issued under the foregoing procedure shall be null and void.'
