AN ACT in Relation to Fees of Referees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 96, § 94, amended. Section 94 of chapter 96 of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 235 of the public laws of 1941, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 94. Court may appoint referees. In all cases in the supreme judicial or in the superior court in which the parties agree that the same may be tried by 1 or more persons as referees, the court may appoint the same, not exceeding 3, whose fees and necessary expenses shall be paid by the county on presentation of the proper certificate of the clerk of courts for that county, and the amount thereof shall be fixed by the court upon the coming in of the report.

No fee or compensation other than his necessary expenses shall be paid any justice of the supreme judicial or of the superior court, for his services as a referee, **but this provision shall not apply to an active retired justice.'**
