STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Duty of Cities with Respect to Registration of Voters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 6, § 24, amended. Section 24 of chapter 6 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 24. Duty of cities in respect to registration. The president of such board shall receive \$5 for each day that the board shall be in session for the revision and correction of the voting lists and for completing the records thereof, as required by the provisions of section 21 of this chapter as amended by chapter 54 of the public laws of 1933. The other 2 members of said boards shall each receive \$4 a day for such time. They Each member of such board shall also receive such a like compensation for each day as may be fixed by the city council for such time as they are necessarily employed in making up and preparing such the lists of voters and the certified copy thereof for the city clerk as required by the provisions of section 20 of this chapter, and their necessary expenses. Cities where such board is established shall provide a suitable place for holding the sessions of said board, and pay the compensation of the members of said board as herein provided and for the services of such officers as said board may employ and have in attendance to preserve order and execute its precepts. Said cities

shall also pay the necessary and reasonable expenses including blank books. stationery, and the necessary assistance of clerks, upon presentation of a certificate of the president of said board stating the number of days employed by each member and the amount due, and a detailed statement of expenses incurred. All witness fees shall be paid at the established rates of fees before municipal courts.'
