STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to White Mountain National Forest.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 11, § 41-A, additional. Chapter 11 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 41-A, and to read as follows:

'Sec. 41-A. Trespass and smoking prohibited; penalty. It shall be unlawful for any person to enter upon, or to smoke upon, lands of the United States of America known as the White Mountain National Forest, as now or hereafter constituted, at any time when such entry or smoking shall be forbidden by valid order made for the purpose of protecting said forest from forest fire, pursuant to the laws of the state of Maine or the United States. Any person violating the provisions of this act shall be punished by a fine of not exceeding \$10.'
