## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Establishing a Game Preserve in the Town of Rangeley, County of Franklin and State of Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Game preserve or sanctuary established in the town of Rangeley, in the county of Franklin and state of Maine. No person shall at any time hunt, chase, catch, kill or destroy any wild animal or wild bird within the limits of the following described tract or territory, situated in Rangeley, in the county of Franklin and state of Maine, to wit:—So much of said town of Rangeley as is bounded as follows, southwesterly by Rangeley lake; northwesterly and northeasterly by route No. 16; and southwesterly by the inlet to Rangeley lake leading from Haley pond, so-called. The territory above-described being so much of said town of Rangeley as lies between Rangeley lake, the outlet of Rangeley lake, route No. 16 and said inlet to Rangeley lake from Haley pond. It shall be unlawful for any person to have in possession at any time, any wild animal or wild bird, or part thereof, taken within the above-described territory. Except, it shall be lawful to hunt foxes, bobcat and Canada lynx from the end of the deer season each year until the closed season on foxes; and with the further exception, the provision of this act shall not apply to the hunting of waterfowl in Hunter Cove, so-called.

Sec. 2. Penalties for violations. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the penalties provided in section 107 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes of Maine of 1930 and amendments thereto.
