STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Conduct of Persons Who Have Communicable
Diseases.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1933, c. 1, § 102, amended. Section 102 of chapter 1 of the public laws of 1933 is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 102. Persons affected with smallpox, etc., shall not mingle with the public. No person afflicted with smallpox, scarlet fever, diphtheria, or any infectious or communicable disease, shall mingle with the general public until such time as such person has become non-infectious or has complied with the regulations of the department of health and welfare for control of the disease with which such person may be afflicted.

Any person who is or has been in direct contact with a person afflicted with any disease as above stated shall comply with the rules and regulations of the department, now in effect or hereinafter adopted, concerning quarantine or necessary measures to render such contacts non-infectious.'
