STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Inactive Savings Accounts of Former Inmates of the State School for Boys.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Inactive savings accounts of former inmates of the state school for boys to be paid into general funds of the state. The Maine Savings Bank of Portland, the Portland Savings Bank of Portland, the Androscoggin County Savings Bank of Lewiston, and the First National Granite Bank of Augusta are hereby directed to transfer to the general funds of the state the funds in savings accounts of former inmates of the State School for Boys which have been inactive for 20 years or more. Provided, moreover, that if the former inmate, the widow, or any heirs or next of kin of any such former inmate, or other lawful claimants do not demand such money within 20 years from the time of its deposit with the state, it shall be forfeited to the state.
