STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relative to Racing Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1935, c. 130, § 13, amended. The 1st paragraph of section 13 of chapter 130 of the public laws of 1935, as amended by chapter 187 of the public laws of 1937, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'If the commission is satisfied that all the provisions of this act and the rules and regulations prescribed by the commission have been and will be complied with by the person, association or corporation applying for a license, it may issue a license which shall expire on the 31st day of December. But between the dates of August + the 1st Monday in August and October 20 no license shall be issued to anyone but an agricultural fair association. The license shall set forth the name of the licensee, the place where the races or race meets are to be held, and the times and number of days during which racing may be conducted by said licensee. Any such license issued shall not be transferable or assignable. Said commission shall have power to revoke any license issued at any time for good cause upon reasonable notice and hearing. The license of any corporation shall automatically cease upon the change in ownership, legal or equitable, of 50% or more of the voting stock of the corporation and the corporation shall not hold a harness horse race or meet for public exhibition, without a new license.'
