STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Medical Examiners.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 151, § 2, amended. The last sentence of section 2 of chapter 151 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'After photographs have been taken and measurements have been made so that the exact condition of the scene can be reproduced, police or any enforcement officer may cause such body to be removed meanwhile to a convenient place. After the medical examiner has performer the duties as provided in section 3, any of the officials mentioned in the 1st sentence of this section, the county attorney or the attorney-general may authorize the permanent removal of such body.'

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
