# STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

### AN ACT Relating to the Signing of Insurance Policies, Except Life.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

License to sign certain insurance policies. The insurance commissioner may in his discretion issue a license to any duly licensed agency in this state which employs one or more stenographers or clerks to execute, sign, and deliver all policies of insurance endorsements, certificates and binders which may be issued by the agency. This does not include, however, either the right or power to execute any fidelity or surety bond; or the right to perform any act or deed not permitted by law. The fee for such license shall be \$2.
