STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Enlarging the Powers and Duties of the State Auditor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. L., 1931, c. 216, Art. VI, § 3, amended. Section 3 of Article VI of chapter 216 of the public laws of 1931, as amended by chapter 27 of the public laws of 1941, is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph to be numbered 7, and to read as follows:
- '7. To have access to whatever records or other data it shall deem pertinent or necessary for the proper examination of any of the matters set forth in the preceding paragraphs, whether these records or other data be definitely the property of the governmental agency under investigation or not; including, without in any way limiting the same, the following: books of account; memoranda; correspondence; checks, whether paid or not; bank accounts, balances, check book records, statements from the banks, etc.; cash and all records thereof, pertaining to, or of possible value in connection with, any matter under investigation under the preceding paragraphs.'
