STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the Penalty for Violation of Certain Sections in the Health and Welfare Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1933, c. 1, § 114, amended. Section 114 of chapter 1 of the public laws of 1933 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 114. Penalty for violations. Whoever wilfully violates any provision of the 25 preceding sections, or of said regulations and by-laws, or neglects or refuses to obey any order or direction of any local health officer authorized by said provisions, the penalty for which is not herein specifically provided, or wilfully interferes with any person or thing to prevent the execution of the provisions of said sections or of said regulations and by-laws shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$50, or by imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or by both such fine and imprisonment; judges of municipal courts and trial justices shall have jurisdiction original and concurrent with the municipal courts and the superior court, of all offenses under said sections.'
