AN ACT Relating to Charges for Examinations of Foreign Insurance  
Companies.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 60, § III, amended. Section III of chapter 60 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. III. Insurance commissioner may examine foreign insurance companies. The insurance commissioner, whenever he deems it necessary for the protection of policyholders, shall visit and examine any insurance company, doing business by agencies in this state, but not incorporated therein. He may employ necessary assistants; ~~all requisite expenses for such examination without the state, shall be borne by the company so examined~~ charges for services in said examination, equal to the charges imposed upon insurance companies of this state for services in such examination by authority of the state where said foreign company was organized, may in the discretion of said commissioner be imposed upon the company so examined; provided, that in relation to the affairs of any company incorporated by or organized under the laws of any of the United States, it shall be optional with said commissioner to accept the certificate of the insurance commissioner or superintendent of the state where said company was organized, as to its standing and condition, or to proceed to investigate its affairs as hereinbefore provided.'
