AN ACT Increasing Fishing and Hunting License Fees During the War.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, a state of war exists between the United States and Germany and Japan; and

Whereas, the lack of sufficient revenue may endanger the whole conservation program; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of Article XXXI of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Increase of fishing and hunting license fees. For the duration of the war with Germany and Japan and for the remainder of the calendar year in which the war ends, an additional 50c shall be charged for all fishing licenses, and all hunting licenses, and an additional \$1 for all combination fishing and hunting licenses.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.
