STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Employing Units under the Unemployment Compensation Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. P. L., 1935, c. 192, § 8, sub-§ (b), amended. Subsection (b) of section 8 of chapter 192 of the public laws of 1935, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
- '(b) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (c) of this section, an employing unit shall cease to be an employer subject to this act only as of the 1st day of January of any calendar year, only if it files with the commission, prior to the 20th day of January of such year, a written application for termination of coverage, and the commission finds that there were no 20 different days, each day being in a different week within the preceding calendar year, within which such employing unit employed & 4 or more individuals in employment subject to this act. For the purposes of this subsection, the 2 or more employing units mentioned in paragraph (2) or (3) or (4) of section 19 (f) shall be treated as a single employing unit.'

graph of subsection (f) of section 19 of chapter 192 of the public laws of 1935 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'(f) "Employer" means: (I) Any employing unit which for some portion of a day, but not necessarily simultaneously, in each of 20 different weeks, whether or not such weeks are or were consecutive, within either the current or the preceding calendar year, has or had in employment, 8 4 or more individuals (irrespective of whether the same individuals are or were employed in each such day);'.
