STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Beauty Culture Apprentices.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1933, c. 282, § 12, amended. Section 12 of chapter 282 of the public laws of 1933, as amended by chapter 112 of the public laws of 1935 and chapter 236 of the public laws of 1939, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 12. Statement to be filed by apprentice; number of apprentices. Every apprentice, in order to avail himself of the provisions of this act, shall within 10 days after entering upon his apprenticeship, file with the secretary of the board, the name and place of business of his employer, the date of commencement of such apprenticeship, and the full name and age of said apprentice, which age shall not be less than 17 years. No beauty shop shall employ more than 1 apprentice for every 2 licensed operators and chairs employed therein, unless said shop shall have complied with the rules and regulations relating to operation of beauty schools; and the statement of each apprentice shall contain said information. Any such apprentice who shall change his place of employment shall promptly

notify the board and furnish it with the name and place of business of his new employer and the date of such change.

Every apprentice, after serving an apprenticeship of 6 months, shall file application for examination at the next examination held by the board in accordance with the requirements of section 4.'
