**AN ACT Relating to Licenses for Sale of Malt Beverages for
Entertainment of Soldiers.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Licenses for sale of malt beverages for entertainment of soldiers, regulated. Licenses for the sale of malt beverages to be consumed on the premises where sold may be issued in the discretion of the state liquor commission to incorporated clubs or unincorporated associations organized on a nonprofit basis for the sole purpose of entertaining members of any branch of the armed services, including the merchant marine, of the United States and its allies, provided that the application therefor be approved by the municipal officers of the city or town in which such intended licensee operates or intends to operate. No fees shall be required of such licensee but in all other respects said licensee shall be subject to all the statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations of licensees for the sale of malt liquor on the premises.

This act shall expire 6 months after an armistice is declared between the United States and Germany or Japan, whichever happens last.
