#### STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 125, § 23, amended. Section 23 of chapter 125 of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 270 of the public laws of 1931, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 23. Commissioner of inland fisheries and game. The commissioner of inland fisheries and game shall receive an annual salary of three thousand dollars \$4,000, provided, however, that the governor and council may increase said salary to an amount not in excess of \$4,000 \$5,000. He shall also receive all necessary traveling expenses.

The governor and council may allow such sum for extra clerk hire, as may be necessary, to be paid out of license fees.'
